How to access your retiree programs

Retiree ID Card

Your Retiree ID card is the key to taking advantage of many of the perks and discounts available to Cornell retirees! You can get one from the University Registrar, located at B07, Day Hall, on or after your retirement date. No appointment is necessary; business hours are M-F, 8 a.m. – 4:15 p.m. Call (607) 255-4232 with questions.

Retiree ID cards are also available at the HR Services & Transitions Center at the East Hill Office Building, 395 Pine Tree Road, Suite 110. Please call in advance, (607) 255-3936 to schedule an appointment.

Perks

CFCU Community Credit Union

If you are a member when you retire, you can remain a member with the same privileges as an active employee. Visit mycfcu.com or call (607) 257-8500 with questions.

TCAT Bus

Use your CU ID card to ride [TCAT buses](#) Monday-Friday in TCAT's Zone One (includes City of Ithaca, Cornell University, Ithaca College, Kendal, the hospital, airport, and mall). A value of \$1.50 each ride! Retirees may also choose anywhere, anytime TCAT transit privileges (\$600 value) in lieu of an annual Cornell parking permit.

Parking (Ithaca campus)

Stop at a Parking and Information Booth and show your Retiree ID to request a one-day, no-fee O or R permit (\$6 value). All

retirees are eligible for a free O parking permit valid in all O, E, and A areas, or a free R parking permit valid in all R, E, and A areas (\$350 value). Retirees with 25+ years of service can request ten one-day Z permits per year for free. Visit the [Parking Services website](#) for details as well as information about accessible parking permits.

Courses at Cornell

Retirees are eligible to enroll in up to six credit hours per semester at no charge. Enroll through [Continuing Education and Summer Sessions](#) in B20 Day Hall, (607) 255-4987. You will need permission from the course instructor and a representative of Benefit Services.

Libraries

Cornell retirees are entitled to full library privileges – your ID is your library card.

Cornell email

Retirees can continue to use their Cornell email address. For questions about other computer access, email the [IT Service Desk](#), or call (607) 255-5500.

Athletic events

Emeritus professors or retirees with 25 years of service are offered two tickets to all athletic contests except Men's Ice Hockey and post-season contests.
