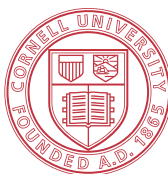
Colleague Network Groups

Employee Assembly

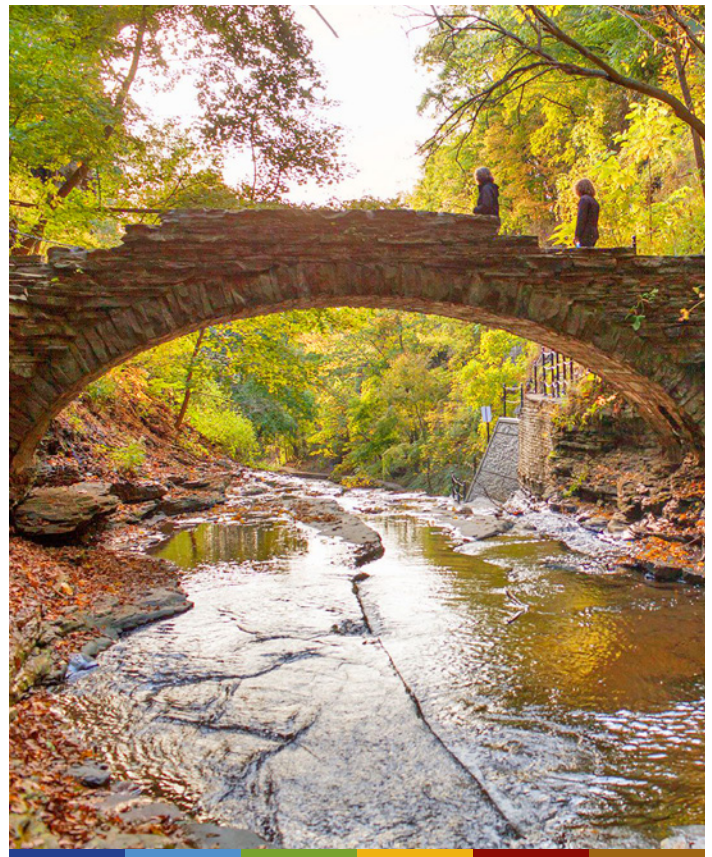
