Recognizing Faculty

Stephen H. Weiss Awards:

- **Presidential Fellow Awards** These fellowships are for tenured faculty members who, in addition to being successful researchers, have a sustained record of commitment to the teaching and mentoring of undergraduate students and to undergraduate education.
- Junior Fellowship Award These fellowships are for tenured associate professors who, in addition to being successful earlycareer researchers, have a sustained record of commitment to the teaching and mentoring of undergraduate students and to undergraduate education.
- Provost's Teaching Fellowship Award These fellowships are for Senior Lecturers, Instructors, Professors-of-the-Practice, Clinical Professors and other non-tenure track title holders who have a sustained record of commitment to the teaching and mentoring of undergraduate students and to undergraduate education.

Cook Awards

The Cook Awards honor Cornell faculty, students, and staff members for their commitment to women's issues and for improving the climate for women at Cornell. The awards are named in honor of the late Constance E. Cook, Cornell's first woman vice president, and the late Professor Emerita Alice H. Cook, founding member of Cornell's Committee on the status of Women.

The Kendall S. Carpenter Advising Award

The Carpenter Award recognizes the sustained and distinguished contributions of professorial faculty and senior lecturers to undergraduate advising, and nominations are solicited annually from all members of the academic community. Nominees must be active contributors to college teaching and to their scholarly field, as appropriate to their appointments, and not have previously won the award.
